The supervising solicitor plays a key role in this, and the defendant has the right to challenge the order after its execution. The court ensures that the order is not overly broad and is used solely to preserve evidence.

They are crucial for plaintiffs seeking to protect their intellectual property rights, especially in situations where defendants might otherwise destroy evidence.
