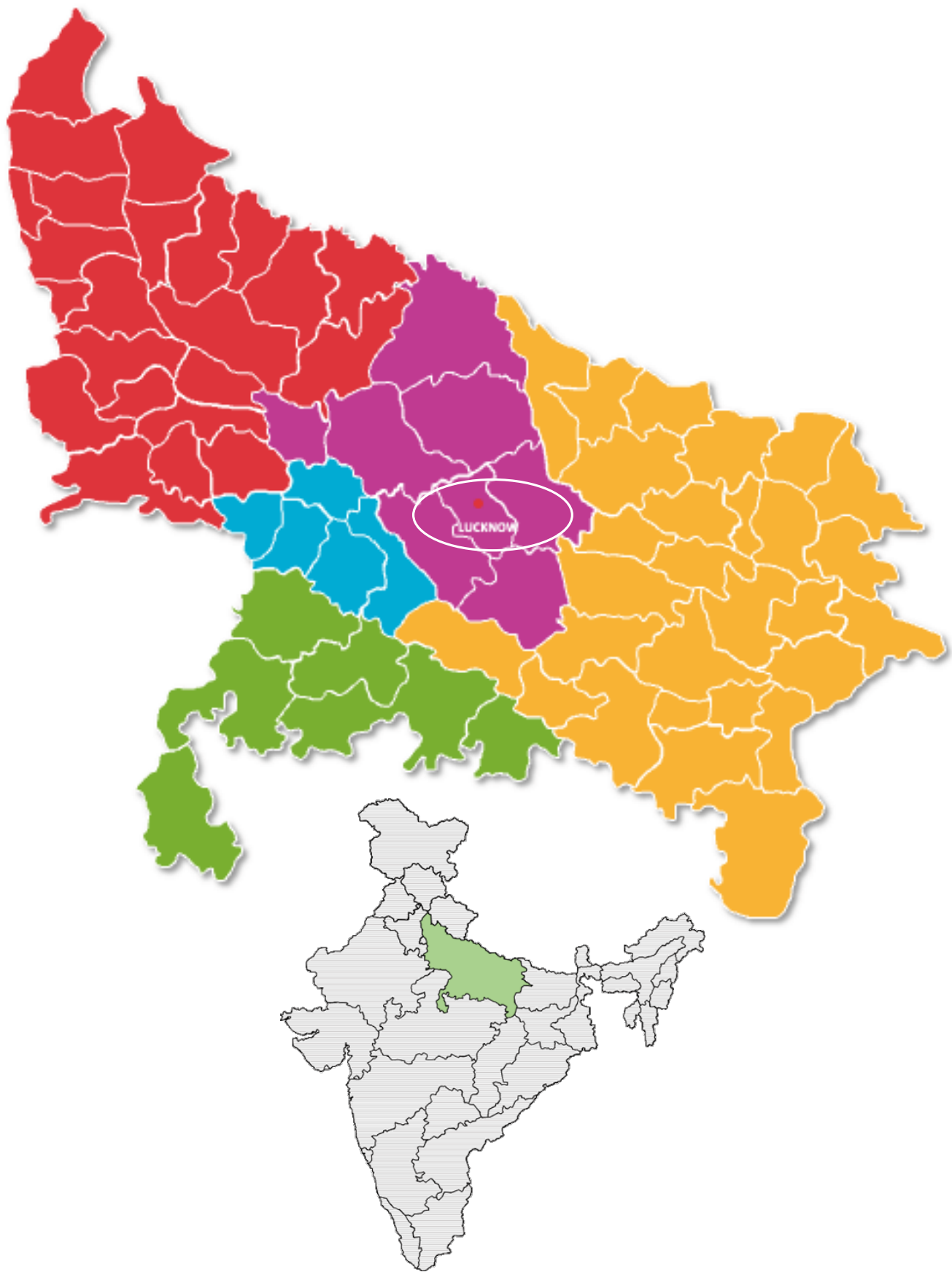

## DISASTERS AND ITS MANAGEMENT:

### Earthquake:

The institute is situated in the area which falls in zone III from the point of earthquake. In order to control the damage if earthquake hits the area, the college has got earthquake resistant infrastructure, as the buildings are built as per Govt. approved building codes.

It is always said that prevention is better than cure. So the institute focuses on spreading awareness among the students and locals. The institute has a plan to organize awareness camps, seminars, conferences with the help of local administrative bodies. Even the college is organizing mock drill practices at proper intervals.

Though the college has its proper emergency evacuation system yet it has planned to build ramps and emergency doors for hassle free movement in emergency.

The college has a determination to aware each and everyone in the campus to have the capability to manage the disasters, yet it has constituted its special team to manage these hazardous situations. So it has given special training to its NSS Unit.

### Fire Outbreaks and Storms:

The incidents of electric short circuits are common in huge buildings. So if incidents of fire outbreaks happen then the institute has sufficient amount of water in its tanks. It has installed fire extinguishers in each part of the buildings to handle the situation. Even the emergency phone numbers are displayed on the board in the campus.

The college is using sirens and digital display board to warn students about approaching storms and instructing them to avoid going near trees and sheds. The instructions are played on the digital board to stay safe.

### Any other Calamities:

The Corona Virus Pandemic has hit in 2020. The life ran under lockdowns and restriction on movement. College managed Pandemic period very vigilantly and learned a lot to face other alike challenges.

# What to Do During an Earthquake

If you are inside when the shaking starts, you should:



### Drop, cover, and hold on.

Move only a few steps to a nearby safe place.



If you are elderly or have a mobility impairment, remain where you are, bracing yourself in place.



If you are in bed, stay there, hold on, and protect your head with a pillow.

You are less likely to be injured if you stay in bed. Broken glass on the floor can injure you.



### Stay away from windows.

Windows can shatter with such force that you can be injured by flying glass even if you are several feet away.



### Stay indoors until the shaking stops and you are sure it is safe to exit.

If you go outside, move quickly away from the building to prevent injury from falling debris.



Check for and extinguish small fires, and exit via the stairs.

If you are in a coastal area:



Drop, cover, and hold on during an earthquake and then move immediately to higher ground when the shaking stops.

Tsunamis are often generated by earthquakes.



Find a clear spot away from buildings, trees, streetlights, and power lines.



Drop to the ground and stay there until the shaking stops.

Injuries can occur from falling trees, streetlights, power lines, and building debris.



If you are in a vehicle, pull over to a clear location, stop, and stay there with your seatbelt fastened until the shaking stops.

Trucks, power lines, poles, street signs, overpasses, and other overhead items may fall during earthquakes. Stopping in a clear location will reduce your risk. Once the shaking has stopped, proceed with caution. Avoid bridges or ramps that might have been damaged by the quake.



If you are in a mountainous area or near unstable slopes or cliffs, be alert for falling rocks and other debris that could be loosened by the earthquake.

Landslides are often triggered by earthquakes.

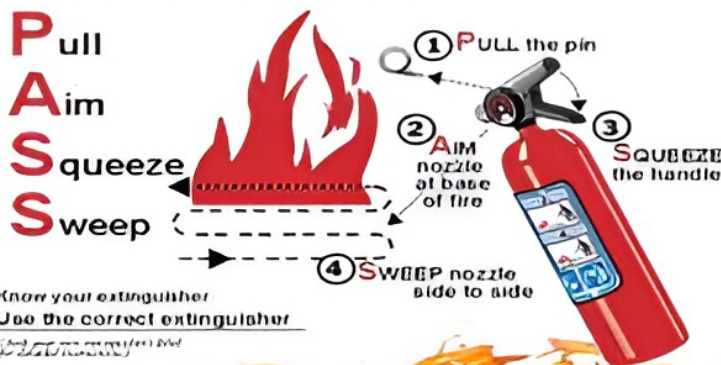

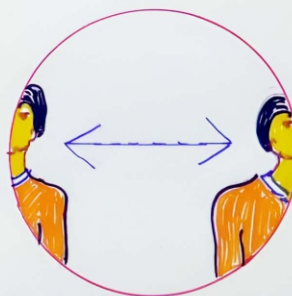

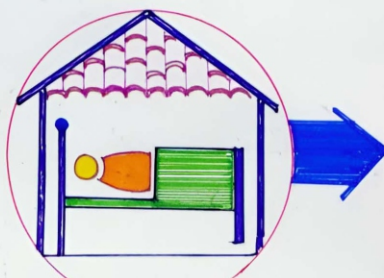

## HEALTH TIPS AFTER FLOODS

After typhoons, heavy rains and flooding, the potential risk of diseases increases, such as **water-borne diseases**, (e.g., typhoid fever, and leptospirosis) and **vector-borne diseases** (e.g., malaria, dengue).



### WATER

Make sure drinking water is from a safe source.



### FOOD

Cook food well, dispose food waste properly.



### PERSONAL HYGIENE

Always wash your hands before eating and after using the toilet.



### STAGNANT WATER

Clear stagnant water in and around the house to prevent mosquito breeding sites.



### SUPERVISION

Do not allow children to wade in floodwaters to avoid diseases, such as leptospirosis.



### CLEAN UP

Clean up your surroundings and destroy mosquito breeding sites.



### CONTAMINATED FOOD

Throw out any food that has come into contact with floodwater, and any food that has perished.



Consult a doctor at once if you, or any household member, have any sign or symptom of infection.

This will help prevent the spread of infection especially if you are in the evacuation area.

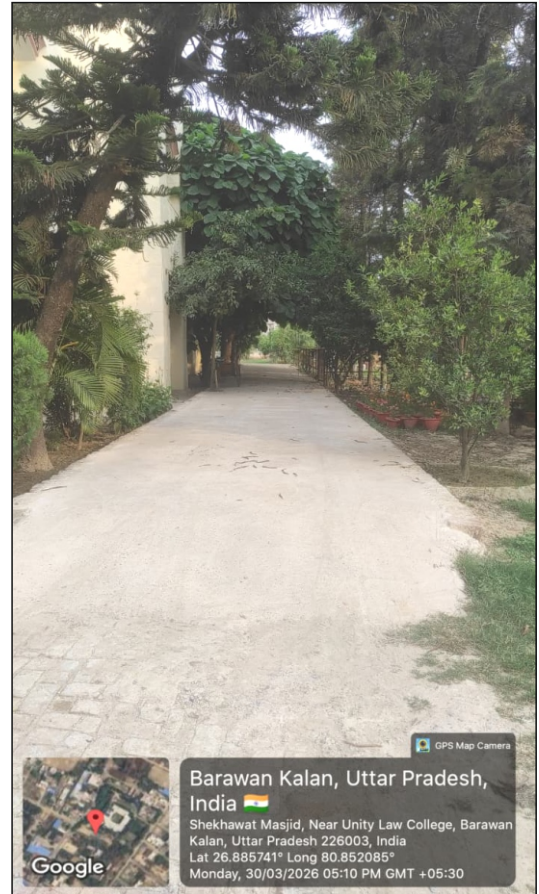
